CANDIDATES' STATEMENTS OF QUALIFICATIONS:

Each candidate may prepare a statement on a form provided by the Registrar of Voters. The statement may contain no more than 200 words, unless the governing body of the local agency has authorized the statement to contain 400 words. The statement must be filed at the same time the Declaration of Candidacy is filed. The **statement may be withdrawn**, **but not changed**, during the nomination period and until **5:00 p.m.** of the next working day after the close of the nomination period. § **13307**

The Registrar of Voters will estimate the total cost of printing and handling the Candidates' Statements and will require each candidate filing a statement to pay in advance his/her estimated pro rata share as a condition of having his/her statement included in the voter's pamphlet. This amount must be paid at the time the Candidate's Statement is filed. If there is an underpayment, the candidate shall be required to pay the balance of the cost incurred. **Overpayments will be refunded within 30 days of the election.** § 13307

The Candidate's Statement is confidential until after the expiration of the filing period, **December 4, 2015, 5:00 p.m.**Copies of all Candidates' Statements will be available for public inspection at the Registrar of Voters' office and on the Registrar of Voters' website for 10 calendar days prior to being submitted for printing.

During this period, Candidates' Statements of Qualifications and Ballot Designations will be available for public examination. These Candidates' Statements and Ballot Designations will be available at the Registrar of Voters' office on **Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.**, and will be posted on the Registrar of Voters' website. During this timeframe, any person may file a writ of mandate or an injunction to require any or all of the material in a Candidate's Statement to be amended or deleted. MILITARY OR OVERSEAS VOTERS' BALLOT

<u>APPLICATIONS:</u> The first day the county elections official may process applications for military or overseas voters' ballots. Any applications received by the county elections official prior to this day shall be kept and processed on or after this date. If the applicant is not a resident of the county to which he or she has applied, the elections official receiving the application shall forward it immediately to the proper county.

NOTE: A request for a vote-by mail ballot from a military or overseas voter will be deemed an affidavit of registration and an application for permanent vote-by-mail status.

To be counted, the ballot returned by facsimile transmission must be received by the elections official no later than Election Day, 8:00 p.m. and must be accompanied by an identification envelope and a signed waiver of a right to a secret ballot.

The county elections official shall register the voter, if not registered, and shall deliver a mail ballot which may be voted in, or outside, the county elections official's office on or before Election Day, 8:00 p.m., and returned as are other voted mail ballots. § 3110

Any mail ballot cast shall be deemed timely if it is received by the elections official via the United States Postal Service or a bona fide private mail delivery company no later than three days after Election Day and either of the following is satisfied: (1) The ballot is postmarked on or before Election Day or is time stamped or date stamped by a bona fide private mail delivery company on or before Election Day, or, (2) If the ballot has no postmark, has a postmark with no date, or has an illegible postmark, but is signed and dated by the voter on or before Election Day, the mail ballot identification envelope is date stamped by the elections official upon receipt of the mail ballot from the United States Postal Service or a bona fide mail delivery company. § 4103

PROVISIONAL BALLOTS OF EMERGENCY WORKERS:

On or before **March 11, 2016**, if the Governor declares a State of Emergency, a provisional ballot cast by an emergency worker outside of his or her home precinct must be received by the county elections official where the voter is registered. The elections official shall transmit for processing

any ballot cast no later than the close of polls on Election Day by an emergency worker in a declared state of emergency, including any materials necessary to process the ballot, to the elections official in the county where the voter is registered to vote. § 14313

COMPLETE CANVASS OF OFFICIAL RETURNS AND

CERTIFY RESULTS BY THIS DATE: No later than this date, the county elections official must complete the canvass and certify its results. § 15372
